- Attendance: 10 individuals were in attendance and are identified in the following categories:

- Attendance was documented by acknowledging the names on the Zoom screen. We had 10 people in attendance.
- The agenda items for today’s meeting were reviewed and no other items were added.
 - An opportunity was provided early in today’s meeting for anyone who would like to share or provide an item for the agenda without having to wait. Kitty Poplaski (Systems Tri-Lead) inquired about the status of the FYSPRT brochure that was developed. The brochure has been reviewed and approved. A purchase order was submitted, and 2500 copies have been professionally printed and are ready for distribution. Three outreach events were attended in June and the brochure has been distributed to community members and multiple organizations. Brochures are available for continued distribution and can be provided to FYSPRT Tri-Leads to assist in this effort.
- Carolyn Cox from SPARK attended and provided an update on the Certified Peer Counselor program for Youth. Virtual classes will begin in July, individuals between 18-27 y/o are able to attend classes, complete the curriculum, and ultimately take the certification test to become a Certified Peer Counselor. Classes will be offered in morning, afternoon, and evening sessions. The classes and education are free of charge, individuals must be at least 18 y/o to be eligible for the certification test. Carolyn indicated she is hopeful to start a program for youth who are incarcerated or in youth homes, involved with Juvenile Justice, etc... Tyus Reed will be the Juvenile Justice Services Coordinator. Carolyn indicated SPARK is looking for educational site hosts where individuals can engage in the CPC curriculum.
- Sam provided an update on WISE services specific to the Salish region. Information from Regional WISE leadership meetings was presented, generating good conversation among the

attendees. WISE program staffing, continuous referrals, and Service Intensity levels were reviewed. A consistent theme of staff retention issues impacted even more by steady referrals to WISE services programs throughout the region illustrate the challenges faced by WISE teams. Salish FYSVRT membership includes multiple members of WISE service provider organizations (WISE supervisors, Parent Partners, etc...) and is committed to supporting WISE services in any way.

6. Sam provided updates to the group regarding the following:
 - a. Tribal Outreach efforts: Outreach events at Lower Elwha have been coordinated for June 29. A professional relationship between Salish FYSVRT and the Quileute Tribe Director of Health is developing. A presentation by Becky George of the Washington Indian Behavioral Health HUB with Volunteers of America Western Washington will occur next month.
 - b. Annual Work Plan: Salish FYSVRT is progressing regarding the identified goals on the Annual Work Plan. FYSVRT members attended three separate outreach events in Clallam county in June and provided the new FYSVRT brochure to individuals and organizations.
 - c. NTEQ: The Narrative Team Effectiveness Questionnaire is a tool to ensure individuals have an opportunity to provide feedback about any element of FYSVRT. This will be sent out tomorrow with the request that they be returned completed no later than Friday, July 2nd.
 - d. FYSVRT Reimbursement and Stipend: This information is included in the new brochure and is shared with individuals and organizations while FYSVRT membership is participating in outreach events.
