Family Youth System Partner Round Table (FYSPRT) Meeting Minutes

March 30, 2020 3:00 – 5:00 PM
Virtual Meeting (Zoom)

1. Introductions: 34 individuals attended this meeting, attendance is identified in the following categories:

2. The group discussed facilitation of the meeting via the Zoom platform. There seemed to be a moderate comfort level with Zoom, some individuals having more experience with it than others. There is no denying one major benefit, that being the dramatic increase in attendance over that of physical meeting locations. Many individuals were attending on computers, several were attending via cell phone. Although we will continue to hope that we can have group meetings, a virtual option such as Zoom needs to be a consistent option moving forward.
3. Jolene Kron, Deputy Administrator of Salish BHASO provided official and current updates on COVID-19 issues impacting region. Jolene presented a Behavioral Health provider services grid explaining service availability and how service delivery has been modified to meet individual’s needs. Attendees were informed that things are changing on a daily basis and information is updated as quickly as possible.
4. Nicole Latson (Family Tri-Lead) and Karen Kelly (WSCC) presented information and facilitated a discussion regarding COVID-19 impacts on schools and students and resulting impacts on parents and families. Many schools are attempting to provide curriculum on-line for students but at present this is inconsistent throughout school districts. The availability of laptop computers for students to complete schoolwork at home is inconsistent as well. Concerns were shared regarding how long this will affect

the school year, academic year completions, graduations, and much more. This was a good discussion that encouraged a lot of participation.

5. Jenna Heil (DBH WISE Program) and Ellie Carrithers (KMHS WISE Clinical Supervisor) provided an informational presentation about WISE services and facilitated an active Q&Q session. Although many of the attendees work in WISE service programs it seemed that there was a lot of interest and participation in the discussion. One benefit was simply that so many WISE staff were able to connect at the same time, talk about what they do, and how WISE benefits Youth and Families. Nicole Latson assisted in the discussion by sharing her lived experience as a parent and that now, after completion of WISE services, how FYSPT continues to be beneficial. Overall this was time well spent and allowed a lot of group participation.
6. Josie Price (Molina, Children's Behavioral Health Administrator) discussed the role of MCO's, time was getting short at this point and we can ensure MCO participation at FYSPT meetings continues.
7. As the meeting neared completion attendees were reminded that we will continue to utilize Zoom. Next Salish FYSPT meeting is scheduled for April 27th, 3:00 - 5:00 PM. It's too early to tell yet when we may be able to have a group meeting again. Other important dates were shared, June 4th Statewide FYSPT, and July 21-22 WISE Symposium in Tacoma. WISE service providers were encouraged to invite Youth and Family to attend our next meeting. Karen Kelly (WSCC) offered to be a presenter at our April meeting, I will follow up with her to identify the details. Overall this was an excellent meeting and has provided results of our stated objective and recent efforts toward increasing attendance and participation.
