		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ They did not feel like they had the supported that they originally thought they did ○ Their children had diagnoses, but they didn't like them being labeled because it changes how people treated them ○ This Tri-lead took over a lot of his services because she didn't feel like they had the support especially since covid lockdown ○ They got into FYSPRT because there was a Flyer that said "Let your voice be heard" ○ FYSPRT has allowed the family to be themselves and share their experiences without judgement ○ Felt supported by other FYSPRT families ○ Had a bad experience with WISe after joining FYSPRT but the other FYSPRT family members supported them while navigating that.
