March 29, 2021 3:00 – 5:00 PM  
Virtual Meeting (Zoom)

- Attendance: 25 individuals were in attendance and are identified in the following categories:

- Attendance was documented by acknowledging the names on the Zoom screen. We had 25 people in attendance.
- The agenda items for today’s meeting were reviewed and no other items were added.
  - An opportunity was provided early in today’s meeting for anyone who would like to share without having to wait. Sam informed the group that Ahney King has left her position with Coordinated Care and is no longer able to continue as a Salish FYSPRT systems Tri-Lead.
- Becca Larsen and Kelsey Lane from Port Angeles School District (PASD) introduced themselves and explained their roles as Family Navigators within PASD. They discussed their work connecting with students and their families to provide as many services as possible to assist students to remain in school. Becca and Kelsey emphasized they “meet families where they’re at” and that they do a lot of home visits. Nicole L. shared some of her history when she was unable to get the kind of assistance that is now available through Becca and Kelsey’s roles, and complimented the PASD on the significant progress being made. This presentation was very informative and encouraged a lot of follow on Q&A.
- Carolyn Cox from SPARK (Students Providing and Receiving Knowledge) presented on the progress being made regarding the Certified Peer Counselor (CPC) for Youth training and the development of the Youth Leadership Network. SPARK is currently recruiting for two positions, one Project Director and one co-Project Director, to move forward on the Certified Peer Counselor training and certification for youth ages 17-21. Carolyn emphasized that youth can complete the 6-week training but must be at least 18 y/o to take the CPC certification test. She indicated that interested individuals can submit applications including a resumé, cover letter, and two references to SPARK.

6. Sam presented WISE data to the group and focused on information specific to the Salish region. Three primary points were presented, and this generated some active conversation within the group.
  - a. All community mental health partners in the region seem to have challenges filling and retaining WISE staffing positions.
  - b. WISE programs are not referring youth and families to FYSPRT upon completion of WISE services.
  - c. All WISE programs remain busy and are working through challenges.

Multiple attendees shared comments related to the three points above, all of which were supportive and understanding. Some family members gave overtly high praise to specific WISE professionals in attendance. Conversation centered around the importance of focusing on the positives and continuing to work collaboratively to support WISE programs and providers.

7. Nicole Earl (Regional Tribal Liaison for Peninsula and Pacific Coast Region) shared her interest in gathering information about WISE. Sam indicated he will assist Nicole by referring her to individuals most knowledgeable about WISE.
8. Kitty provided an update on the work that has been accomplished on the FYSPRT informational tri-fold.
9. Next meeting of Salish Regional FYSPRT is scheduled for April 26, 2021, 3:00 – 5:00 PM.
