She explained that any individual that identifies a Tribal affiliation will be assisted with connection to services and resources. Tribal affiliation is not verified prior to assistance being provided. The HUB is 	

		connected to VOAWW and can be accessed by calling the crisis line. She indicated she has business cards and SWAG containing contact information. Sam informed her that Salish FYSPRT is active in outreach efforts and would be happy to spread the HUB information items if she will provide them.	
4	Discussion regarding community outreach efforts and continued event scheduling.	✓ Sam reviewed the outreach events attended by Salish FYSPRT members in June (Port Angeles, Sequim, Forks, Lower Elwha, Peninsula Behavioral Health). He also discussed upcoming events (Kitsap Pride Celebration July 31 st , Kitsap county Fair and Stampede Aug 25-29). Other events were identified by Colleen (Back-to-School fairs in P.A. on Aug 21, and Sequim Aug 28). Sam-2 informed r/t Back-to-School Bash hosted by Coffee Oasis (will provide dates when known).
